Director's Update JOE FRAZIER, CWDP

Over the past two months, I have continued to settle into my role as Workforce Development Board Director. Since the last newsletter, I have continued to meet and work alongside a multitude of community partners and stakeholders on workforce and career pathway development initiatives. Our Annual Job Fair has also been a large project, in which I have been able to work in conjunction with staff at our local OMJ centers to plan and host the event. The SE Node for Broadband and 5G training has had multiple training cohorts and enrollments are increasing. HAPCAP's Broadband Coordinator is working with local participants to deliver quality-driven case management services. I have also been spending time at each OMJ center, learning about their individual needs as well as assisting with policy and a variety of projects.

Finding new funding streams that will benefit the employers and residents of Area 14 has been an important focus and I have been able to submit and or assist with multiple funding proposals in the past two months. I will continue to monitor for promising opportunities and pursue grant funding that aligns with the needs of our local communities.

With all this in mind, I am very optimistic about what the future holds for our local communities and look forward to the journey ahead.

QUEST Grant Update BROADBAND & 5G

Staff in Area 14 have been working hard on promoting Broadband & 5G careers, as well as enrolling participants in training programs. HAPCAP's Broadband Coordinator, Jocelyn Howard has been attending community events to promote awareness, developing marketing items and working with trainees to enroll them in QUEST funded programming. To date, 11 participants have been enrolled in approved training programs, utilizing QUEST funds. Director Frazier was also able to present at Tri-County Career Center and Hocking College's Broadband Business Advisory Council.

Director Frazier was on hand for an exciting announcement at Trimble High School, where Hocking College President Young, announced the Sam Jones Trimble Promise Scholarship. This is a pilot program in which every 2024 Trimble High School graduate will be able to attend Hocking College in the fall of 2024, with no out-of-pocket expenses.





GRIT Conference & Funding LEAP FORWARD WITH GRIT

Director Frazier was in attendance at the 2024, Leap Forward with GRIT Conference. GRIT works to help both students and adults meet their self-sufficiency goals through employment.

Director Frazier was able to bring back information and new connections to partners in Area 14, with multiple local entities pursuing GRIT funding for their programs! OhioMeansJobs-Athens County recently received funding from GRIT, which will be used for training and supportive services for customers!

<u>What is CCMEP?</u>

The Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program is Ohio's employment program for young adults (ages 14-24). Designed to assist one of Ohio's most vulnerable populations, CCMEP provides employment and training services to eligible, low-income individuals based on a comprehensive assessment of employment and training needs, as well as a basic skills assessment.

CCMEP can provide:

- Career coaching
- Job placement
- Tuition assistance
- Mentoring
- Financial aid
- Transportation support

- Work experience provided with a real-world component
- Educate and prepare local youth on job readiness skills
